Graduate Program on Latin America

The interdisciplinary and inter-university Graduate Program in Latin America Studies provides both training and a research forum for doctoral students in the social sciences and the humanities working on Latin America. Students come from widely ranging fields such as politics, sociology, history, anthropology, cultural studies, geography, and environmental studies. At its core is a training module that consists of two workshops per term, as well as other activities such as practical skills courses and retreats. Regularly held workshops allow post-graduate students to address theoretical and methodological questions, as well as facilitate contact with domestic and international experts. The overall aim of the ProDoc is to foster outstanding interdisciplinary exchange and research that transcends national, political, and ethnic boundaries. The ProDoc is an open graduate program that allows doctoral students to attend single workshops and events.
